A CEREMONY to honour the memories of the 35,000 Irish men and women who served in the two world wars will be held in the city this Remembrance Sunday.

A poppy wreath will be laid at the city's war memorial in Pery Square, in the presence of former servicemen and women, Limerick's City and County councillors, and other officials.

Mayor of Limerick, Cllr Gerry McLoughlin will represent the city in laying a poppy wreath.

He will be joined by Cathaoirleach Jerome Scanlan, representing the county.

The Remembrance ceremony will take place at 10.45am at Pery Square in Limerick.

A two minute silence will be held at 11am as a mark of respect and esteem for those who courageously fought in the wars.

It will be followed by Mass at St Joseph's Church at 11.30am, or a Church of Ireland service in St Mary's Cathedral from 11.15am.

SHANNON Airport received a timely boost this week with news that US Airways is to resume its daily service to Philadelphia next year.

The resumption of the service after four years will bring an additional 30,000 passengers through Shannon when the schedule starts on May 22.

The announcement comes on foot of United Airline's recent unveiling of a five-time weekly service to Chicago, expected to carry a further 20,000 passengers on its seasonal schedule, which starts next June.
